shall be _____ shekels, and for a female ten shekels; ⁶ and if from a _____ old up to five years old, then your valuation for a _____ shall be five shekels of silver, and for a female your valuation shall be _____ shekels of silver; ⁷ and if from sixty years old and above, if *it is* a male, then your valuation shall be _____ shekels, and for a female ten shekels.

⁸ But if he is too _____ to pay your valuation, then he shall present himself before the _____, and the priest shall set a value for him; according to the ability of him who vowed, the priest shall _____ him.

⁹ If *it is* an _____ that men may bring as an offering to the LORD, all that *anyone* gives to the LORD shall be holy. ¹⁰ He shall not _____ it or exchange it, good for bad or bad for _____; and if he at all exchanges animal for animal, then both it and the one exchanged for it shall be _____. ¹¹ If *it is* an unclean animal which they do not offer as a sacrifice to the LORD, then he shall present the _____ before the priest; ¹² and the priest shall set a value for it, whether it is good or ____; as you, the priest, value it, so it shall be. ¹³ But if he *wants* at all to redeem it, then he must _____ one-fifth to your valuation.

¹⁴ And when a man dedicates his _____ to be holy to the LORD, then the priest shall set a _____ for it, whether it is good or bad; as the priest values it, so it shall stand. ¹⁵ If he who dedicated it *wants* to _____ his house, then he must add one-fifth of the _____ of your valuation to it, and it shall be his.

¹⁶ If a man dedicates to the LORD _____ of a field of his possession, then your valuation shall be according to the _____ for it. A homer of _____ seed *shall be valued* at _____ shekels of silver. ¹⁷ If he dedicates his field from the Year of Jubilee, according to _____ valuation it shall stand. ¹⁸ But if he dedicates his field _____ the Jubilee, then the _____ shall reckon to him the money due according to the years that remain till the Year of Jubilee, and it shall be _____ from your valuation. ¹⁹ And if he who dedicates the field ever wishes to _____ it, then he must add one-fifth of the money of your valuation to it, and it shall belong to him. ²⁰ But if he does not want to redeem the field, or if he has _____ the field to another man, it shall not be redeemed anymore; ²¹ but the field, when it is released in the Jubilee, shall be _____ to the LORD, as a devoted field; it shall be the possession of the _____.

²² And if a man dedicates to the LORD a field which he has _____, which is not the field of _____ possession, ²³ then the priest shall reckon to him the worth of your valuation, up to the Year of Jubilee, and he shall give your _____ on that day as a holy offering to the LORD. ²⁴ In the Year of Jubilee the field shall _____ to him from

whom it was _____, to the one who owned the land as a possession. ²⁵ And all your valuations shall be according to the shekel of the sanctuary: twenty gerahs to the shekel.

²⁶ 'But the firstborn of the _____, which should be the LORD's firstborn, no man shall dedicate; whether it is an _____ or sheep, it is the LORD's. ²⁷ And if it is an unclean animal, then he shall redeem it according to your valuation, and shall _____ one-fifth to it; or if it is not redeemed, then it shall be _____ according to your valuation.
