Chapter 4

Vs 24 His fame went throughout all _____ and they brought to Him all sick people who were afflicted with various diseases and torments and those who were demon-possessed, epileptics, and paralytics; and He healed them.

Chapter 8

Vs 2 A _____ came and worshiped Him, saying "Lord, if You are willing, You can make me clean." Jesus put out His hand and touched him, saying, "*I am willing; be cleansed.*" Immediately his leprosy was cleansed. And Jesus said to him, "*See that you tell no one; but go your way, show yourself to the _____, and offer the gift that Moses commanded, as a testimony to them.*"

Vs 5 Now when Jesus had entered Capernaum, a _____ came to Him, pleading with Him saying "Lord, my servant is lying at home paralyzed, dreadfully tormented." And Jesus said to him, "*I will come and heal him.*" The centurion answered and said, "Lord, I am not worthy that You should come under my roof. But only speak a _____, and my servant will be healed. For I _____ am a man under authority, having soldiers under me. And I say to this one, "Go," and he goes; and to another, "Come" and he comes; and to my servant "do this" and he does it." When Jesus heard it, He marveled and said to those who followed, "*Assuredly, I say to you, I have not found such great faith, not even in Israel! And I say to you that many will come from _____ and west, and sit down with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven. But the sons of the kingdom will be cast out into outer darkness. There will be weeping and gnashing of _____.*" Then Jesus said to the centurion, "*Go your way; and as you have believed, so let it be done for you.*" And his servant was healed that same hour.

Vs 14 Now when Jesus had come into Peter's house, He saw his wife's mother lying sick with a _____. So He touched her hand, and the fever left her. And she arose and served them.

Vs 16 When even had come, they brought to Him many who were demon-possessed. And He cast out the spirits with a _____ and healed all who were wick,

Vs 23 Now when He got into a _____, His disciples followed Him. And suddenly a great tempest arose on the sea, so that the _____ was covered with the waves. But He was asleep. Then His disciples came to Him and awoke Him saying, "Lord, save us. We are perishing." But He said to them, "*Why are you fearful, O you of little faith?*" Then He arose and rebuked the winds and the _____, and there was a great calm. So the men marveled, saying "Who can this be, that even the winds and the sea obey Him?"

Vs 28 When He had come to the other side, to the country of the Gergesenes, there met Him _____ demon-possessed men, coming out of the _____, exceedingly fierce, so that no one could pass that way. And suddenly they cried out, saying, "What have we to do with You, Jesus, You Son of God? Have You come to torment us before the time?" Now a good way off from them there was a herd of many _____ feeding. So the demons begged Him, saying "If you cast us out, permit us to go away into the herd of _____." And He said to them, "Go." So when they had come out, they went into the herd of swine. And suddenly the whole herd of _____ ran violently down the steep place into the sea, and perished in the water. Then those who kept them fled; and they went away into the city and told everything, including what had happened to the demon-possessed men. And behold, the whole city came out to meet Jesus. And when they saw Him, they begged Him to depart from their region.

Chapter 9

Vs 1 So He got into a boat, crossed over, and came to His own city. Then behold, they brought to Him a paralytic lying on a bed. When Jesus saw their faith, He said to the paralytic, "*Son, be of good cheer; your _____ are forgiven you.*" And at once some of the scribes said within themselves, "This Man blasphemes." But Jesus, knowing their thoughts, said "*Why do you think evil in your hearts? For which is easier, to say, 'Your sins are forgiven you,' or to say, 'Arise and walk?' But that you may know that the Son of Man has power on earth to forgive sins*"—then He said to the paralytic, "*Arise, take up your bed, and go to your house.*" And he arose and departed to his house. Now when the multitudes saw it, they marveled and glorified God, who had given such power to men.

Vs 18 While He spoke these things to them, behold a ruler came and worshiped Him, saying, "My _____ has just died, but come and lay Your hand on her and she will live." So Jesus arose and followed him, and so did His disciples. And suddenly, a woman who had a flow of _____ for _____ years came from behind and touched the hem of His garment. For she said to herself, "If only I may touch His garment, I shall be made well." But Jesus turned around, and when He saw her He said, "*Be of good cheer, daughter; your _____ has made you well.*" And the woman was made well from that hour. When Jesus came into the ruler's house, and saw the _____ players and the noisy crowd wailing, He said to them, "*Make room, for the girl is not dead, but sleeping.*" And they ridiculed Him. But when the crowd was put outside, He went in and took her by the _____ and the girl arose. And the report of this went out into all that land.

Vs 27 When Jesus departed from there, _____ blind men followed Him, crying out and saying "Son of David, have mercy on us." And when He had come into the house, the blind men came to Him. And Jesus said to them, "*Do you believe that I am able to do this?*" They said to Him, "Yes, Lord." Then He touched their eyes, saying, "*According to your faith let it be to you.*" And their eyes were opened. And Jesus sternly warned them, "*See that no one knows it.*" But when they had departed, they spread the news about Him in all that country.

Vs 32 As they went out, behold, they brought to Him a man, mute and demon-possessed. And when the _____ was cast out, the mute spoke. And the multitudes marveled, saying "It was never seen like this in Israel!" But the Pharisees said, "He casts out demons by the _____ of the demons."

Chapter 12

Vs 9 Now when He had departed from there, He went into their synagogue. And behold, there was a _____ who had a withered _____. And they asked Him, saying, "Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath?"—that they might accuse Him. Then He said to them, "*What man is there among you who has one sheep, and if it falls into a pit on the Sabbath, will not lay hold of it and lift it out. Of how much more value then is a man than a _____? Therefore it is lawful to do good on the Sabbath.*" Then He said to the man, "*Stretch out your hand.*" And he stretched it out, and it was restored as whole as the other. Then the Pharisees went out and plotted against Him, how they might destroy Him.

Vs 22 Then one was brought to Him who was demon-possessed, blind and mute; and He healed him, so that the blind and mute man both _____ and saw. And all the multitudes were amazed and said, "Could this be the Son of David?" Now when the Pharisees heard it they said, "This fellow does not cast out demons except by Beelzebub, the ruler of the demons."

Chapter 14

Vs 17 And they said to Him, "We have here only five loaves and _____ fish." He said, "*Bring them here to Me.*" Then He commanded the multitudes to sit down on the grass. And He took the _____ loaves and the two _____, and looking up to heaven, He blessed and broke and gave the loaves to the disciples; and the disciples gave to the multitudes. So they all ate and were filled, and they took up _____ baskets full of the fragments that remained. Now those who had eaten were about _____ thousand, besides women and children.

Vs 24 But the boat was now in the middle of the sea, tossed by the _____, for the wind was contrary. Now in the _____ watch of the night, Jesus went to them, walking on the sea. And when the disciples saw Him walking on the sea, they were troubled, saying "It is a _____." And they cried out for fear. But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, "*Be of good cheer! It is I; do not be afraid.*" And Peter answered Him and said, "Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water." So He said, "*Come,*" And when _____ had come down out of the boat, he walked on the water to go to Jesus. But when he saw that the wind was boisterous, he was afraid; and begging to sink he cried out, saying "Lord, save me." And immediately Jesus stretched out His hand and caught him, and said to him, "*O you of little faith, why did you doubt?*" And when they got into the boat, the wind ceased. Then those who were in the boat came and worshiped Him, saying, "Truly, You are the Son of God."

Vs 34 When they had crossed over, they came to the land of Gennasaret. And when the men of that place recognized Him, they sent out into all that surrounding region, brought to Him all who were sick, and begged Him that they might only touch the _____ of His garment. And as many as touched it were made perfectly well.

Parables and Examples Matthew 1-14

Chapter 13

Vs 3 *Behold a sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seed fell by the wayside; and the _____ came and devoured them. Some fell on stony places, where they did not have much earth. But when the _____ was up they were scorched, and because they had no root they withered away. And some fell among thorns, and the thorns sprang up and choked them. But other fell on good ground and yielded a crop, some a hundredfold, some _____, some thirty. He who has ears to hear, let him _____!"*

Vs 18 *Therefore hear the parable of the sower: When anyone hears the word of the kingdom, and does not understand it, then the wicked one comes and snatches away what was sown in his _____. This is he who received seed by the wayside. But he who received the seed on stony places, this is he who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy; yet he has no _____ in himself, but endures only for a while. For when tribulation or persecution arises because of the word, immediately he stumbles. Now he who received seed among the thorns is he who hears the word, and the cares of this world and the deceitfulness of riches choke the word, and he becomes unfruitful. But he who received seed on the good ground is he who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and produces; some a hundredfold, some _____, some thirty."*

Vs 24 *"The kingdom of heaven is like a man who sowed _____ seed in his field; but while men slept, his enemy came and sowed tares among the wheat and went his way. But when the grain had sprouted and produced a crop, then the _____ also appeared. So the servants of the owner came and said to him, "Sir, did you not sow good seed in your field? How then does it have tares?" He said to them, "An _____ has done this." The servants said to him, "Do you want us to go and gather them up?" But he said, "No, lest while you gather up the tares you also uproot the _____ with them. Let both grow together until the harvest, and at the time of harvest I will say to the reapers, "First gather together the _____ and bind them in bundles to burn them, but gather the wheat into my _____."*

Vs 37 *"He who sows _____ seed is the Son of Man. The field is the world, the good seeds are the sons of the kingdom, but the tares are the sons of the wicked one. The enemy who sowed them is the _____, the harvest is the end of the age, and the reapers are the _____. Therefore as the tares are gathered and burned in the fire, so it will be at the end of this age. The Son of Man will send out His angels, and they will gather out of His kingdom all things that offend, and those who practice lawlessness and will cast them into the furnace of fire. There will be wailing and gnashing of _____. Then the righteous will shine forth as the sun in the kingdom of their Father. He who has ears to hear, let him hear."*

Vs 31 "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard _____, which a man took and sowed in his field, which indeed is the least of all the seeds, but when it is grown it is greater than the herbs and becomes a _____, so that the birds of the air come and nest in its branches."

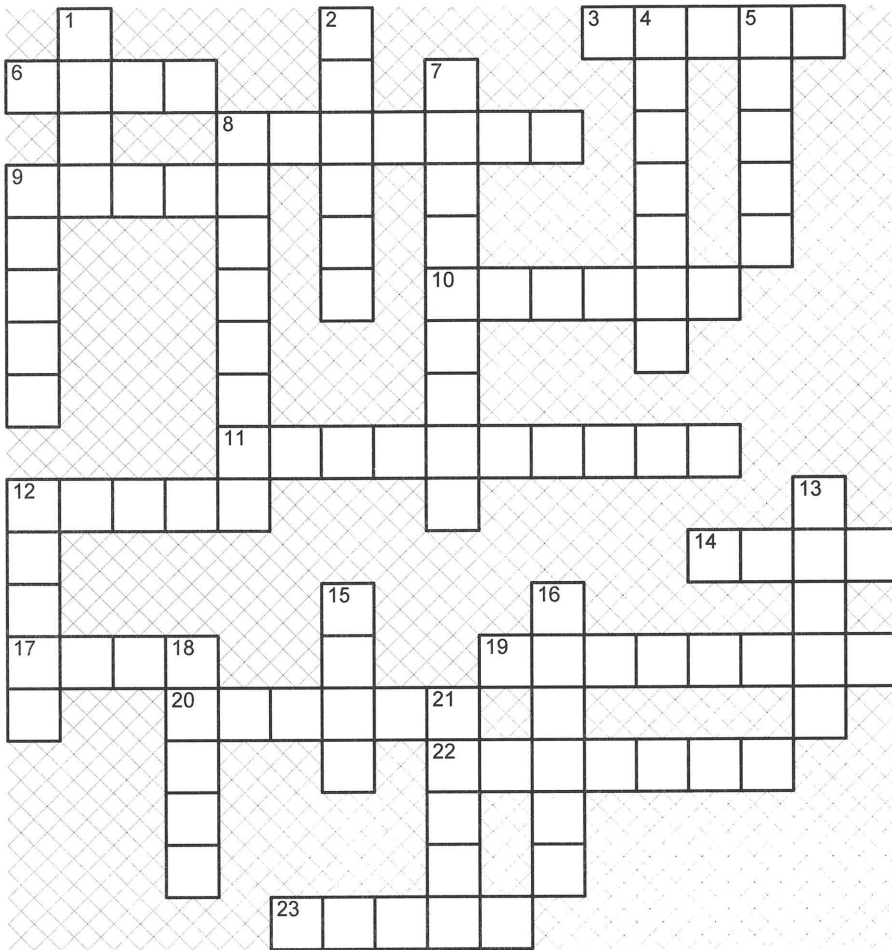
Vs 33 "The kingdom of heaven is like leaven which a woman took and hid in _____ measures of meal till it was _____ leavened."

Vs 44 "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a treasure hidden in a _____, which a man found and hid; and for joy over it he goes and sells _____ that he has and buys that field."

Vs 45 "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant seeking beautiful pearls, who, when he had found one _____ of great price, went and sold _____ that he had and bought it."

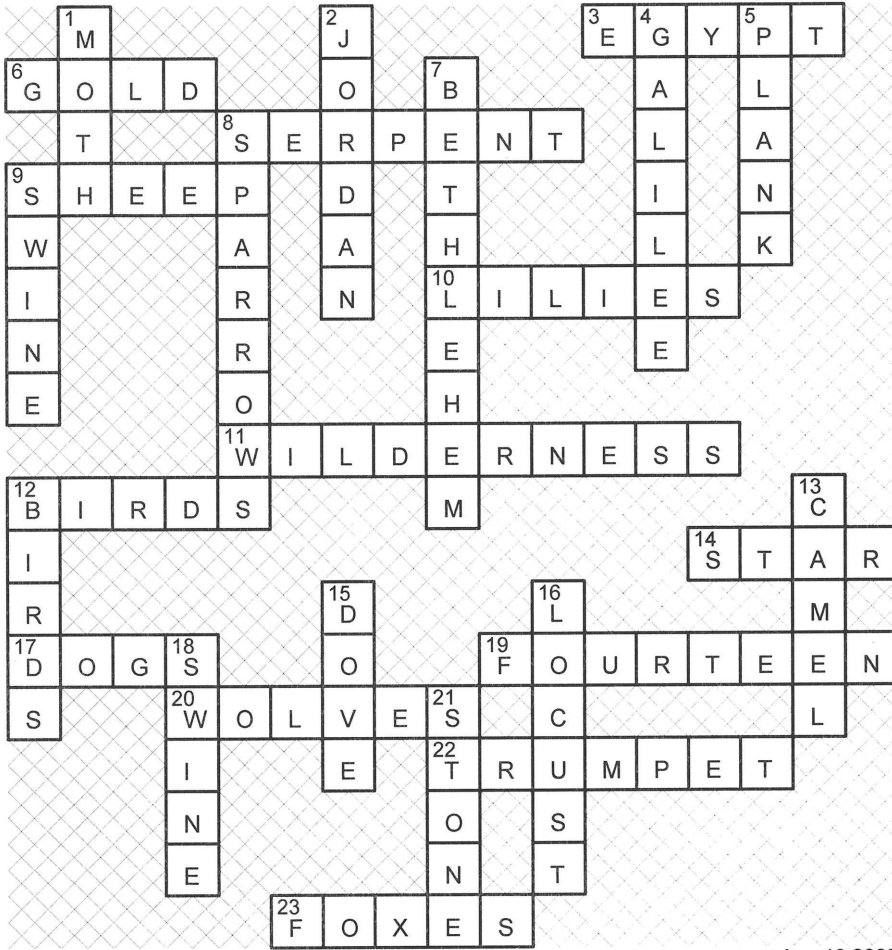

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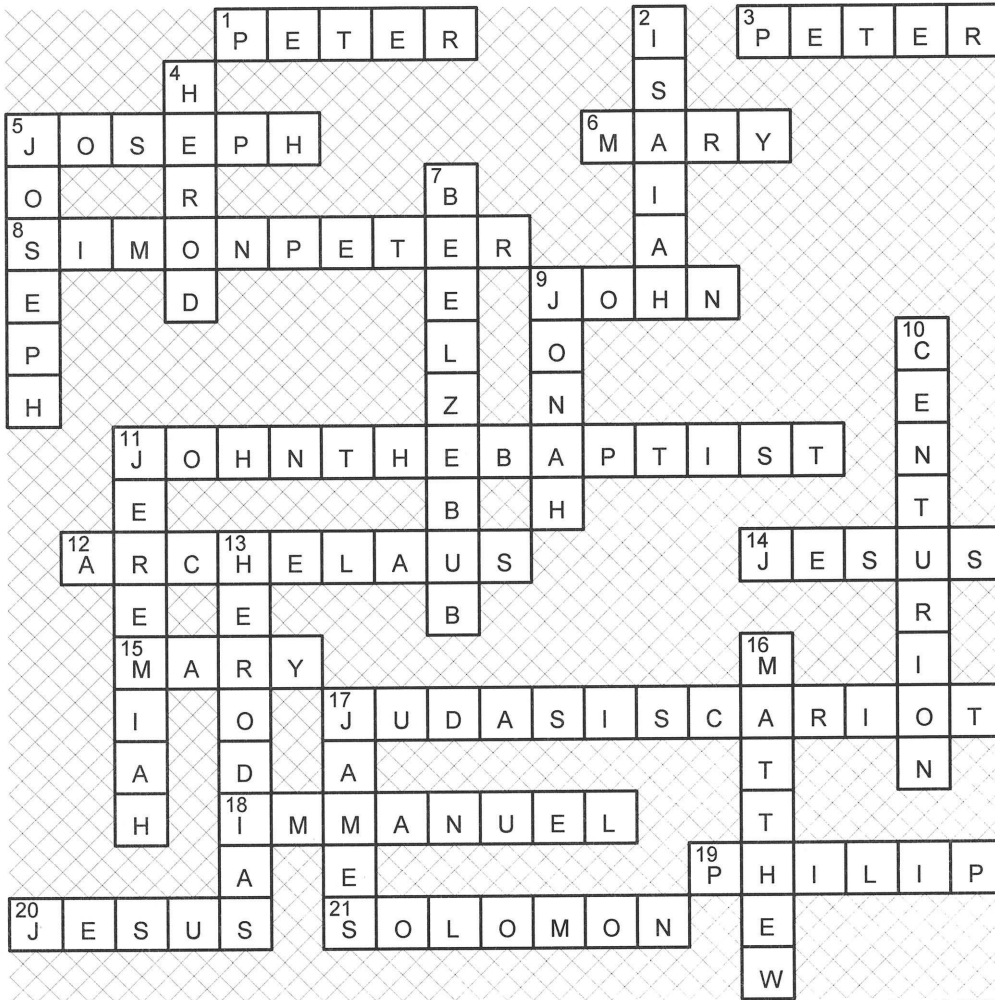

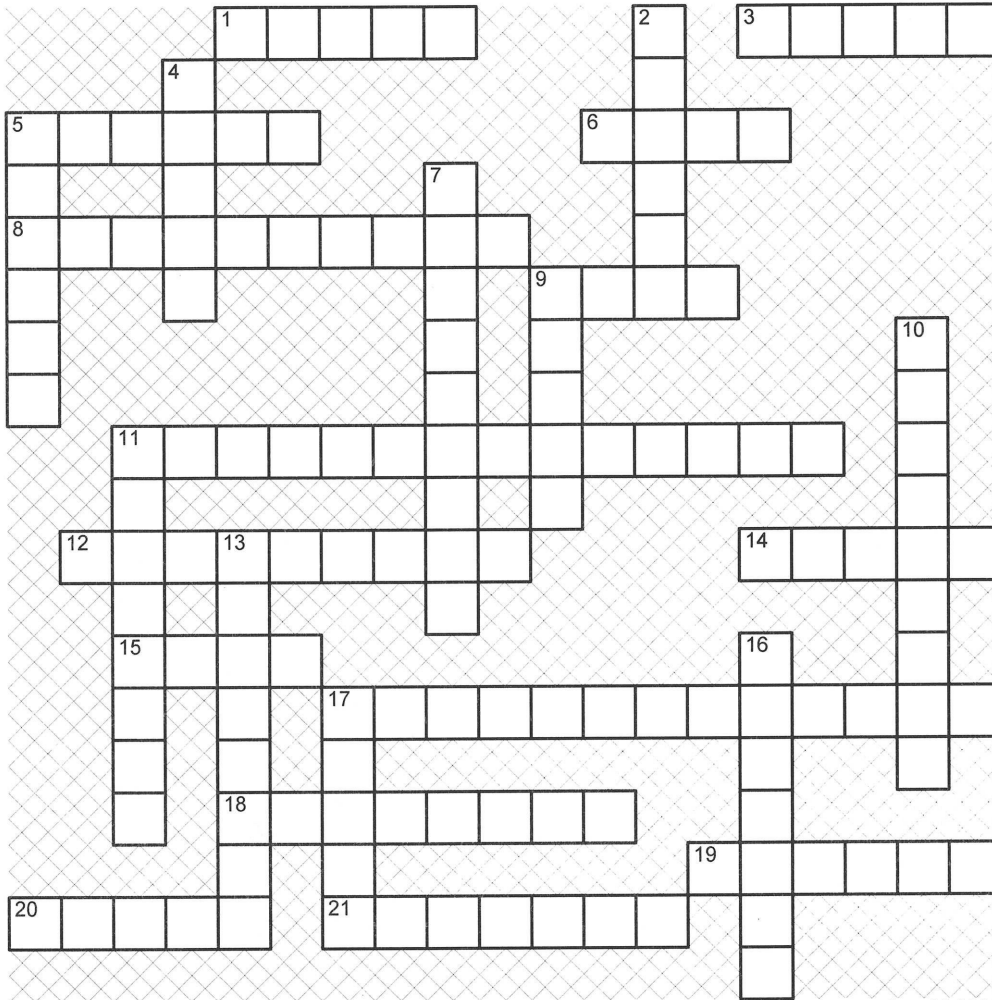

Whoever swears by the altar, it is nothing; but whoever swears by the gift that is on it, he is obliged to perform it

Fools and blind! Which is greater, the gift or the altar that sanctifies the gift?

Therefore he who swears by the altar, swears by it and by all things on it.

He who swears by the temple, swears by it and by Him who dwells in it.

And he who swears by heaven, swears by the throne of God and by Him who sits on it.

For you cleanse the outside of the cup and dish, but inside they are full of extortion and self-indulgence.

Blind Pharisee

first cleanse the inside of the cup and dish, that the outside of them may be clean also.

Woe to you scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites!

For you are like whitewashed tombs which indeed appear beautiful outwardly, but inside are full of dead men's bones & all uncleanness.

Even so you also outwardly appear righteous to men, but inside you are full of hypocrisy and lawlessness.

Woe to you scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites!

Because you build the tombs of the prophets and adorn the monuments of the righteous

and say, "If we had lived in the days of our fathers, we would not have been partakers with them in the blood of the prophets."
